ENS-005 BLOWHOLE AND SHOPPING

Watch mesmerizing La Bufadora blowhole spew seawater high into the air, discover the historical side of Ensenada and shop along the main thoroughfare. You will find the blowhole, one of the world's largest marine geysers, on the Punta Banda peninsula. It shoots water as high as 65 feet, a continuous natural spectacle caused by the ocean's waves being forced into a partially submerged cave with only one exit—a hole at the top. Back in Ensenada, you will tour the Hotel Riviera del Pacifico, a Spanish-style resort built in 1930 with an on-site casino. The infamous Al Capone was supposedly a regular and may have funded its construction. You will also enjoy two opportunities to shop. One at an open-air market; the other along the main boulevard of Lopez Mateos. As you browse the inviting boutiques, you will find a collection of art, perfumes, fine leather goods and casual clothing.

- Watch a blowhole spew ocean water more than six stories high each time a wave rolls in.
- Tour a Spanish-style hotel where the notorious Al Capone was supposedly a regular.
- Shop in an open-air market for merchandise such as jewelry and hand-painted ceramics.
- Browse the more upscale shops along Ensenada's main boulevard.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

The Hotel Riviera del Pacifico is another highlight that overlooks the well-protected harbor. This rambling Spanish-style resort was built in 1930 and once held a casino that Al Capone supposedly frequented. You will next head into the nearby Guadalupe Valley, which has become known as the "Napa of Mexico," in part because more than three-quarters of Mexico's wines are produced here. At one of the valley's most acclaimed wineries, you will sample several reds and whites that are characteristic of the region. Afterwards, you may opt to be dropped off in downtown Ensenada to shop and return to the ship on your own later.

Cruise to Todos Santos, a pair of uninhabited islands a few miles west of Ensenada that are known for spectacular snorkeling. On the way there, you may well spot dolphins frolicking in the ocean, a variety of sea birds and most likely surfers riding the waves as you approach the rugged coastline. After dropping anchor not far offshore, you will have the chance to snorkel in one of the sheltered coves. The Pacific waters in this area are teeming with marine life, and you can expect to see all sorts of colorful tropical fish. Many of them live in the kelp forest beneath the surface, including the garibaldi, a bright orange fish that is California's official state fish. You may also view mantas and eagle rays gracefully swimming by and lobsters and sea stars on the ocean floor. Following your snorkeling adventure, drinks and fresh fruit will be served back on board.

- Snorkel waters teeming with marine life off the islands of Todos Santos.
- Look for bright orange garibaldi fish in the kelp forests and lobsters on the ocean floor.
- Watch for dolphins frolicking in the sea while cruising to and from Todos Santos.
- Change of clothes recommended, bring towel, sunglasses, windbreaker/light jacket and hat.

Founded in 1888, it is one the oldest wineries in Baja California, and you will have the opportunity to sample some of its most characteristic wines. The tempranillo is particularly outstanding and one of the reasons that Bodegas de Santo Tomas is so well respected. Following the tasting, you will transfer back to Ensenada's main shopping area where you can browse the shops.

- Visit a historical hotel overlooking the port, where Al Capone was supposedly a regular.
- Sip an icy margarita at the hotel, a nod to the drink supposedly being created there.
- Sample outstanding wines such as pinot noir and barbera at a nearby winery.

After being serenaded by a mariachi band in full costume, you will be treated to a performance of traditional songs and dances associated with the region. Time will also be allotted to shop and browse the enlightening museum on site.

During your time with the Kumiai, you will watch them weaving baskets of willow branches and grasses using traditional techniques and see a performance of dances, songs and chants. For a deeper understanding of their ways, you can browse the museum in the Kumiai community. You will also have the opportunity to sample their traditional foods, much of which contains corn and acorns. The Kumiai consider oak trees sacred, as their diet was largely acorns before they abandoned their nomadic lifestyle and started to grow corn. Although you may hear the people speaking in native Kumeyaay, it is in danger of becoming a lost language.

ENS-012 GUADALUPE VALLEY ATV ADVENTURE

Take the wheel of an ATV and tear off into the hinterlands of the Guadalupe Valley, one of the most hauntingly beautiful areas in Baja California. As you race through the rugged terrain in a caravan of vehicles, you will enjoy spectacular views of the surrounding mountains and indigenous pine forests. Incredibly, almost all of Mexico's wines are produced in this valley, a land with a microclimate that is similar to but drier than that of the Bordeaux region in France. More than a 150 wineries are now located in the valley and in a way they are simply following a tradition, as Jesuit priests first cultivated vines here in the 18th century. Once you return to the ATV base camp, you will enjoy a tasting of wines from the Guadalupe Valley, which has become known as the Napa of Mexico. Regional cheeses and fresh-baked artisan bread will also be served.

- Watch a performance of traditional songs and dances in Ensenada's cultural center.
- Spend free time exploring the venue, a former hotel and casino from the 1930s.
- Enjoy a margarita, shop for handicrafts and discover the property's notorious history.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

ENS-010 EL SALTO HIKING

Hike through one of the most spectacularly picturesque canyons in the Guadalupe Valley with a knowledgeable guide that will describe the area's fascinating natural history. The deeper you hike into El Salto canyon, the more dramatic the terrain. The walls will become so steep in places that not even the midday sun will reach the bottom of the canyon. El Salto, which means The Jump, is strewn with massive boulders, and at times you must hop from one to another to make your way along the trail. The difficulty of the route will make the hike all the more rewarding. To enhance the adventure, the guide will elaborate on the geological formation of this black-rock canyon and whatever wildlife you may come across. Birds such as red-tailed hawks and Western kingbirds are often spotted. You might also see spiny lizards sunning on the boulders and scurrying about the arid terrain.

Tacos also take center stage in the restaurant Manzanilla, where you will snack for a third time. The seafood there is sourced locally as are the flavorful herbs and spices. Famed husband-and-wife chefs Benito Molina and Solange Muris own Manzanilla and are passionate about the quality of their ingredients. You will see where much of the seafood in Ensenada is sold at a nearby market, where you will enjoy one last taco, most likely with shrimp and cheese.

- Dine on seafood-based Mexican dishes at several of Ensenada's most famous venues.

In time, you will arrive at the acclaimed Monte Xanic winery, a low-volume winery where the grapes are handpicked at night, pressed, fermented and aged in French oak barrels. Monte Xanic produces more than a dozen wines under four different labels, several of which you will sample. You may taste a deep-red Gran Ricardo, a Bordeaux-style wine created to honor the memory of one of the winery's founding partners.

- Take off in a Jeep and head into the Guadalupe Valley wine region.
- Take in the hauntingly rugged terrain, which eventually gives way to fertile farms.
- Learn the conditions that contribute to the wines that are produced in the valley.
- Savor several wines at a tasting at the award-winning Monte Xanic winery.

On the way there, the crew will prepare your fishing tackle and describe the kinds of species that are often caught here. You might hook a muscular Pacific sailfish capable of extreme bursts of speed up to 60 miles per hour. Wahoo can often be found around drop-offs and are easy to identify by their long slender bodies marked with zebra-like stripes. Brightly colored mahi mahi, also known as dorado, typically make long runs and leap out of the water during the battle to land them. Whatever you catch, it will be a thrill to reel in and then release back into the sea for another day.
